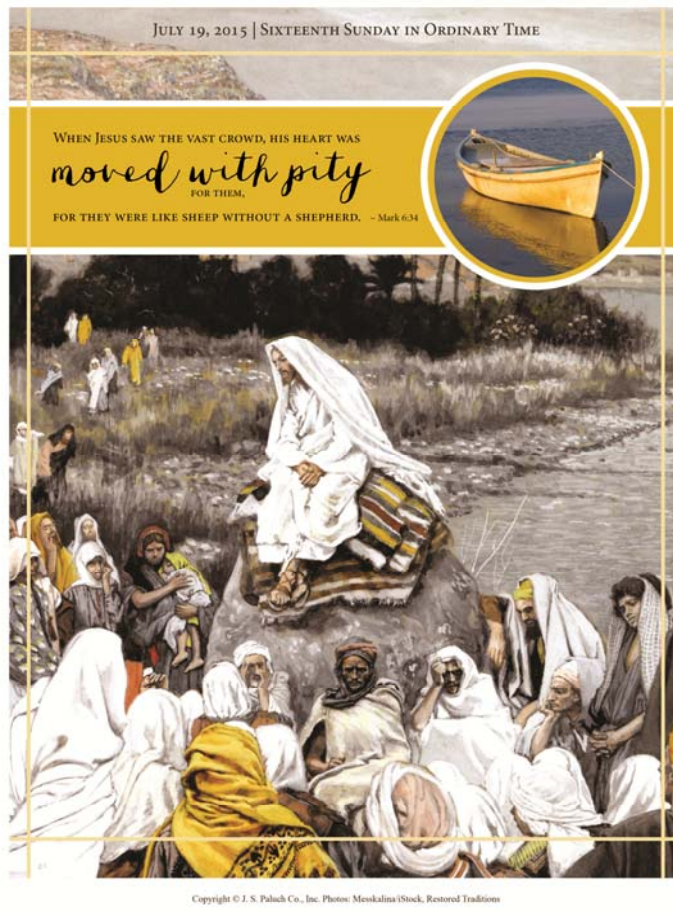

From Our Pastor, Fr. Fausto ...

My Dear Friends,

Last Sunday's Gospel presented to us the famous mission of the twelve, whom Jesus sent to prepare the villages to receive the announcement of the Good News of the Kingdom of God. From the recommendations of Jesus, we had the vision of the monastic and friars life of Christianity: living together in community and poverty.

Naturally, the group of apostles was composed of married men, only John, the beloved, was single and that explains the deepest attachment and undivided love he had for Jesus. Also, remember that in the winter and in the rainy season, the apostles went back home to their families, and in the good season they traveled with Jesus, bringing the Good News to Israel. When traveling with the good Lord, the apostles were sustained by the alms of the people (a tradition which continues up to now) administered by the group treasurer, Judas Iscariot, and served by a group of ladies deeply dedicated to the Good News. I suspect that things not always went smoothly and the Gospel tells us that one time Jesus' mother and relatives came to see him because they thought that his emotional and physical well-being were threatened.

That group around Jesus prayed, preached, dined and danced, took care of the sick and of the poor. In a few centuries, the ideal of community living around Jesus in the Eucharist gave birth to the monks and nuns with the famous monastic rules of St. Benedict and St. Scholastica.

Notice how Jesus realizes the universal need for R & R, rest and relaxation, for Himself and his disciples, as today's Gospel recounts. How are you doing with your vacation? Just NEVER MISS SUNDAY MASS, except in those localities where it is almost impossible to find a Catholic Church (always check www.masstimes.org). From the time of the risen Lord breaking bread with His disciples at Emmaus up to now, over two thousand years later, the center of our faith has been the Eucharist, our total immersion in the Divinity, Body and Soul. Some of our Protestant sisters and brothers insist on baptism only. While it is true that we have to open the door to enter into the joyful warmth and security of our house, and the door of the house of God is our Baptism, we cannot remain just inside the door!

Once again, our Religious Education office is planning this year's Activity Week from August 3 to 7. The theme is EVEREST: CONQUERING CHALLENGES WITH GOD'S MIGHTY POWER. It is for children age 4 to 10 and the cost is \$35 per child. It is not too late to register, and registration packets are available in the Parish Office. It is always a fun and thoughtful week!

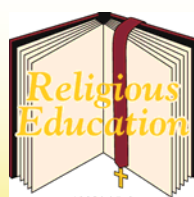

Decimosexto Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario 19 de julio de 2015

Viene un tiempo, dice el Señor, en que haré surgir un renuevo en el tronco de David. -- Jeremías 23:5a

LA PRESENCIA DE CRISTO EN EL MUNDO

Hay una cierta "conexión" que falta entre las dos primeras oraciones del Evangelio de hoy. En la primera los apóstoles regresan de la misión a la que habían sido enviados de dos en dos ("apóstol" en griego significa "enviado"). Habían sido enviados a predicar la conversión, a expulsar a los demonios, y a sanar a los enfermos en el nombre de Jesús. En la segunda oración, Jesús les dice que se vengán con él a un lugar solitario para descansar un poco. Nos gustaría pensar que, entre esas dos oraciones, una expresión de placer y gratitud cruzó el rostro de Jesús al oír como el Reino ha sido proclamado en su nombre, y como no tuvieron que sacudirse el polvo de los pies en ninguna parte. ¡Bien se merecían un descanso! A nosotros tampoco nos vendría mal, cuando nos juntamos alrededor de Jesús como los apóstoles en el Evangelio de hoy, que nos tomáramos un descanso, para que el Señor pueda escuchar lo que hemos hecho en su nombre -nuestros éxitos, nuestras decepciones, nuestra necesidad de "escaparnos" un rato con él para que nos fortalezca para seguir trabajando en el nombre de Dios. Ya que nosotros los bautizados no somos sólo el rebaño de Cristo; por el agua y el Espíritu hemos sido transformados en el Cuerpo mismo de Cristo, la presencia del pastor para dar vida al mundo.



We Also Are Shepherds

In today's first reading, God tells us: "I will appoint shepherds for them who will shepherd them so that they need no longer fear and tremble..." Our lives are filled with shepherds who care for us and love us. We, too, must recognize those times when we need to be shepherds for others. It is our rapport with the Lord, our ability to allow Him to guide us, which provides us with the strength and wisdom to shepherd others.



The connection between the Shepherd and His love for the flock can be seen in today's Gospel. Although Jesus and His disciples were tired from a long day, when He saw the crowds He was "moved with pity for them," and His compassion outweighed everything else. There are times when we, too, are weary and feel like we can do no more. However, if we are committed to live as good stewards, we must respond to the need we see around us.

It is this stewardship of our family, friends, co-workers and others which allows us to show the love we are expected to demonstrate. Even our word "pastor" derives from the Latin word for "shepherd." An anonymous quote perfectly captures what our relationship to the Lord should be: "When you cannot sleep, do not count sheep; talk to the Shepherd."
