From our Pastor, Fr. George...

Dear Parishioners of St. Martha, Sunday Sermon – 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

(1 Kings) Elijah called Elisha from field plowing to become a prophet in Israel. Elisha killed the animals that pulled the plow and *he then used the plowing equipment for fuel to boil their flesh and gave it to his people to eat*. Elisha did not hesitate to become Elijah's assistant. He didn't look back; he didn't keep any item of his former profession and he showed that he was committed to it. When God called him, Elisha obeyed, he left his old life behind him and followed his new master, Elijah.

Paul speaks about freedom that Jesus gives us: "For freedom Christ set us free; stand firm and do not submit to the yoke of slavery" (Galatians5:1). He speaks about freedom from anything selfish which could take us from the service of love to our neighbors. Anything that takes us away from serving Christ and our neighbor, stands in the way of love.

(Luke) Gospel: *Proclaim the kingdom of God in various places, put you whole heart into it, revive people's faith.*

Samaria was the territory between Judea and Galilee west of the Jordan river. For ethnic and religious reasons, Samaritans and Jews were bitterly opposed to one another. This explains why one Samaritan village refused to welcome Jesus; they didn't know him, they only knew that he was a Jew who was travelling to Jerusalem. Jesus didn't hold this against them, he moved on to another village. James and John wanted to punish that village and send the fire from heaven on it, but Jesus rebuked them for such extreme intentions. If one refuses to welcome the Good News, go to someone else who will welcome it. Be prepared to meet opposition, hostility and even persecution. Don't give up, don't get discouraged. Be smart.

In these sayings Jesus speaks of the severity and the unconditional nature of Christian discipleship. Even family ties and filial obligations, such as burying one's parents, cannot distract one, no matter how briefly, from proclaiming the kingdom of God. *Proclaiming the Gospel is so important that it takes precedence before anything else.*

Let the dead bury their dead – let the spiritually dead (those who do not follow) bury their physically dead. This is about the revival of faith through the right hierarchy of values. Some people lost it and they are spiritually dead. Something that the church Hymn **Seek Ye First** sings about. It says other things will be added unto you if you first seek the Kingdom of God.

Solemnity of St. Peter and St. Paul (June 29th)

Our Liturgical Ordo tells us that **Peter**, who died in the year 64 in Roma under Nero, was a Galilean fisherman and the spokesman for the Twelve who became the "Prince of the Apostles". Two epistles are ascribed to him, and he is the patron saint of those in the fishing industry.

Paul, according to tradition, was martyred in Rome in the year 67. He was a Pharisee who became the "Apostle of the Gentiles". His letters may be dated from 50-65 and he is the patron of the lay apostolate: the Cursillo Movement and Catholic Action; also of Malta and Greece.

May God bless our Church through the intercessions of Saints Peter & Paul.

Church roof replacement information

Bishop Frank J. Dewane, who attended the St. Martha Finance Council meeting on April 6th, 2022 recommended for the replacement of the Church roof. Following, the Chancellor of the Diocese of Venice, Dr. Volodymyr Smeryk attended the St. Martha Finance Council meeting on April 27th, 2022 and confirmed this recommendation, referencing the water leaks. The Diocese proposed Crowther Roofing Company who prepared a quote for the roof replacement. The Finance Council looked into obtaining two other quotes, but due material and labor issues, none of the companies that were approached were able to help us at this time. In order to avoid price increases, the Diocese requested a decision from the Pastor to begin the project and so now we expect the work to begin soon. We will keep you updated with any disruptions that may affect access to the Church and the Mass schedule.
