From our Pastor, Fr. George...

Dear Parishioners of St. Martha,

Sunday Sermon – Third Sunday of Advent in the Year "A" Last Sunday we heard from the Gospel reading about John the Baptist baptizing people at the Jordan river and preparing them for the coming of Christ. He preached to hundreds of people about the Anointed One, who was coming to baptize people with the Spirit and fire. His preaching and witness to Jesus were confident and powerful, many people were happy to hear it and they believed in John's message.

But today's Gospel reading is different. It reports to us that John is in prison, and it tells us that he became uncertain about Jesus, and he needed assurance and direction.

He was imprisoned by king Herod the tetrarch because John reproached him about taking his brother's wife as his own wife. John courageously defended the commandments of God. He probably knew that he will not be allowed to walk free from king's chains, and he knew that this was a last chapter of his life, and he was getting impatient to see the Messiah's ministry. Preparing for the coming of the Messiah was his life vocation, his prophetic role and he wanted to see the beginning of the messianic time before he died.

This explains sending of his disciples to Jesus with the question: Are you the one who is to come, or should we look for another? He wasn't doubting in Jesus, he was rather saying: please let me see my dreams come true. Tell me that I have fulfilled my duty.

The answer Jesus gave him was the biblical description of the messianic times prophesied by the prophet Isaiah long before Christ: the blind regain their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have the good news proclaimed to them. By comparing himself to the prophecy about the Messiah, Jesus assured John that he is the one and that John did his job well. Moreover, Jesus praised John and said that he was more than a prophet.

God's plan is sometimes different from what we think it should be. There are things happening that we don't understand. Like John who wanted to see Jesus in action, didn't receive the whole message of redemption of Christ at the time when he needed it. That message was fully revealed only after the Pentecost, when the Holy Spirit taught the apostles all about Jesus. It wasn't given to John, to see everything about Jesus and in consequence he asked questions. The Gospel doesn't tell us whether John was satisfied with the response he received from Jesus or not. We can presume that he did, because he knew the Scriptures and he knew the prophesy of Isaiah so he would have understood the response correctly.

But then he was suddenly and brutally beheaded while in the king's custody. Could he have been saved by Jesus, the Messiah, who healed the sick and raised the dead? Of course, he could have been saved. But when Jesus said that John was more than a prophet, didn't he mean to prophesy the martyr's death of the Baptist, who would also precede Jesus himself in death as he did in his birth and in his ministry? More than a prophet, meant: my brother, my help and support, my predecessor, the man who persevered in obedience to God to the end, my inspiration. There is a lesson of a holy impatience for us today. Together with St. John the Baptist we learn to look forward to see Jesus coming to us. We learn to be impatient in expecting the Lord's coming. We also ask questions, like: Are you the one who is coming? We do it, not because we have doubts but because we want to meet Jesus and see his kingdom. We believe in it, and we want to be part of it.

O Blessed Mother, you received the good news of the incarnation of Christ, your S on, with faith and trust. Grant your protection to all pregnant mothers facing difficulties.




