

From Our Pastor, Father George June 2, 2024

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

One paragraph of the Sequence for today's feast of Corpus Christi speaks about the ancient types of the sacrifice of Christ:

Truth the ancient types fulfilling, Isaac bound, a victim willing, Paschal lamb, its lifeblood spilling, manna to the fathers sent. – Today's Missal, p. 21

Isaac bound, a victim willing. This line speaks about the free choice, the willingness to become a sacrificial gift. Jesus truly fulfills what Abraham's sacrifice of his son Isaac meant to manifest. Similarly to Isaac Jesus offered himself willingly to the Father. With the difference that Jesus knew what he was doing, and Isaac wasn't fully aware of what Abraham was going to do to him.

The spilling of blood of the Paschal lamb saved the Jews in Egypt when they used it to sprinkle the door posts with it. The Angel of Vengeance killed all the firstborn in Egypt apart from Jewish firstborn, whose houses were marked with the blood of the Paschal lamb. Jesus is truly the Lamb of God whose blood was poured on the cross and saves all who believe in Him.

The manna to the fathers sent, was sent by God from heaven to the chosen nation who wondered through desert on the way to the promised land. Jesus tells us that He is the true Bread of life who comes from heaven and whoever eats his bread will live forever.

This feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ makes us aware of how the ancient history led to Jesus and how he fulfilled the old prophesies and promises. This feast shows Jesus as the central figure of the human history and the history of salvation. He is the Lamb of God who willingly offered himself and then became the bread of life. This feast reminds us that this history is fulfilled, it led to Jesus and his New Covenant and explain the meaning of the Eucharist.

St. John Paul II in his Encyclical Letter called: On the Eucharist says: "The Eucharist is indelibly marked by the event of the Lord's passion and death, of which it is not only a reminder but the sacramental re-presentation. It is the sacrifice of the Cross perpetuated down the ages. This truth is well expressed by the words with which the assembly in the Latin rite responds to the priest's proclamation of the 'Mystery of Faith': We announce your death, O Lord.

Not just a reminder but sacramental re-presentation. This means that the sacrifice of Christ is taking place for you right then when you take part in the Holy Mass.

It is the sacrifice of the Cross perpetuated down the ages. The cross offering of the Lord's blood is taking place when you are at the Holy Mass. Jesus offers himself on your behalf whenever you participate in the Mass.

On this feast of the Corpus Christi (Latin: for the Body of Crist) we celebrate, we thank God and we learn to respond well to this greatest Gift.

The willingness of the Lord to offer himself for us.

His cross on which he poured his blood for us.


Ordination of transitional Deacon to the

This amendment to the Florida constitution would allow abortion up until birth, including when the baby is capable of feeling pain, and would eliminate laws requiring parental consent and safety protocols for women. Let's say 'No' to this amendment.
